

PUBLIC NOTICE OF PRIVATE PLAN CHANGE 13

Proposed Private Plan Change 13 to the Hamilton City Operative District Plan: Te Rapa Racecourse

CLAUSE 5, SCHEDULE 1, RESOURCE MANAGEMENT ACT 1991

Hamilton City Council has accepted Private Plan Change 13 to the Hamilton City Operative District Plan 2017 for processing and is now calling for submissions under Schedule 1 to the Resource Management Act 1991 (RMA).

The private plan change applies to a 6ha portion of Te Rapa Racecourse accessed off Sir Tristram Avenue and Ken Browne Drive.

Key elements of the plan change include:

- Rezoning of Major Facilities to Medium Density Residential to enable a mix of dwellings.
- Rezoning 1100m² of land on Te Rapa Road from Major Facilities to Industrial Zone.
- Stormwater.
- Noise.
- Reverse sensitivity.

WHERE CAN I VIEW THE PLAN CHANGE?

Proposed Plan Change 13 is available to review at Council's offices in Garden Place, at all the Hamilton City Libraries and online at hamilton.govt.nz/PlanChange13.

MAKING A SUBMISSION

Anyone may make a submission on Plan Change 13. You don't have to be an expert, a resident or ratepayer of Hamilton.

Submissions can be:

- delivered to Council offices in Garden Place
- posted to Freepost 172189, Hamilton City Council, Private Bag 3010, Hamilton 3240, Attn: Plan Change 13 Submission
- emailed to planchange@hcc.govt.nz

The submission period starts on 15 February 2023 and closes on 15 March 2023.

You must state in your submission form whether you wish to be heard in support of your submission. The relief you seek through your submission(s) must be clearly set out.

PROCESS FOR PUBLIC PARTICIPATION


- After submissions have closed, Council will prepare a summary of submissions and give public notice of the availability of this summary and where both the summary and submissions can be viewed.
- The following persons may make a further submission in support of, or in opposition to, the submissions already made:
 - o Any person representing a relevant aspect of the public interest.
 - o Any person who has an interest in the proposal greater than the general public has.
 - o Council itself.
- If a person making a submission asks to be heard in support of their submission, a hearing must be held.
- Council must give its decision on the provisions and matters raised in the submissions (including its reasons for accepting or rejecting submissions) and give public notice of its decision.
- Any person who has made a submission has the right to appeal against the decision on Plan Change 13 to the Environment Court. Any appeal must be confined to matters referred to in the submission or further submission.

Submissions close on Wednesday 15 March 2023.
